Families Use Software App to Manage Hemophilia

CCBD hemophilia patients are using a smart phone application to help track their condition and share information with their care team. Patients (or parents) use the app to keep track of factor infusions, doses and bleeding incidents, and get reminders using an electronic calendar. They can also take photos of bleeds and send them electronically to the Comprehensive Center for Bleeding Disorders so care teams can advise as needed.

About 12 CCBD patients so far are using the MicroHealth Hemophilia app, which is compatible with iPhone, iPad, iPod Touch and Android devices. Other hemophilia apps are available, but MicroHealth is the app most commonly used by CCBD patients and staff. It is free and available online, with English and Spanish versions.

The app helps reduce the use of paper forms, calendars and stickers to keep track of infusions, medications and medical appointments. Patients can quickly email or send information via the app, instead of having to mail, fax or take lots of papers to clinic visits. Some versions of the app can scan barcodes on factor boxes to automatically record lot number, expiration date or dose.

"I've been so impressed with the detail our patients provide with the MicroHealth electronic calendar," said Dr. Sheryl Moss, Outreach Coordinator at CCBD. "This is a fantastic tool because patients and providers can quickly see bleed frequency at any time. In this app, bleeds appear in a different color than your prophy. Patients can easily spot a problem and call the center. We can then adjust treatment plans instead of trying to reconstruct a calendar at your clinic appointment," she said.

Two Moms Who Are Making it Work

Two Milwaukee-area moms have been dedicated appusers, and they say it has made life easier.

Julia Morales, whose 5-year-old son Miguel has Hemophilia A Severe, has used the MicroHealth app on her iPhone for at least 4 years. She learned about it from her older brother, who also has hemophilia. Julia uses the app to get reminders for factoring. If her son has a bleeding incident, it makes it easy to keep track of when

and why he may need an extra dose.

"I think the app is awesome," Julia said. "It's not hard – all you have to do is click to send the information. It makes your life a whole lot easier. If we go on vacation, I don't have to bring all the paperwork I used to. I just have to bring all of his supplies. It's also easier to fit all of the info into the app. If you have any problems with it, you can ask MicroHealth. There are other apps out there, but this one seems like the easiest and most convenient to use," Julia added.

Christina Ruiz, whose 4-year-old son Yadir has Hemophilia B Severe, has used the MicroHealth app for about two years. She uses it on her Android

phone to see reminders and keep track of her son's bleeding incidents. She also takes photos of any bumps or bruises her son gets, then sends the photos to CCBD so they can advise her about extra factor doses if needed – which she can keep track of more easily with the app.

"It makes life easier," Christina said. "It's simple to use with easy steps to follow, and I've had no problems with it. It synchs up with Gmail and Google calendars, and it's a lot easier to stay on the infusing schedule on a regular basis," she said.

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Open Enrollment for Health Insurance: Now's the Time

As Fall brings changing colors and cooler weather, it's also the time of year many employers will notify employees of upcoming changes to your health insurance. This time period is called open enrollment, and it varies from employer to employer.

Did you know if you do not have access to employer insurance you may be able to enroll in health insurance through the Health Insurance Marketplace? The Marketplace also has open enrollment once a year. Some people may even qualify for Medicaid. If you have questions about enrolling in health insurance, please contact CCBD and ask to speak with a social worker.

Important dates to remember for the Health Insurance Marketplace:

- November 1, 2016: Open Enrollment began. It was the first day you could enroll, re-enroll or change a 2017 insurance plan through the Health Insurance Marketplace. Coverage can start as soon as January 1, 2017
- December 15, 2016: Last day to enroll in or change plans for coverage to start January 1, 2017.
- January 1, 2017: 2017 coverage starts for those who enroll or change plans by December 15.
- January 31, 2017: Last day to enroll in or change a 2017 health plan. After this date, you can enroll or change plans only if you qualify for a Special Enrollment Period.

MyChart is available. Sign up today!

MyChart lets you view portions of your medical record online. It's free, and a safe and secure way you can help manage and receive information about your health. MyChart offers patients personalized and secure online access to portions of their medical records. You can:

- View medical history, including medications, immunizations and allergies
- Receive most outpatient lab results online
- Access trusted health information resources
- Send secure messages to your provider
- Request prescription renewals online
- Track your child's growth

To create a MyChart account at Children's Hospital of Wisconsin, your provider must give you an activation code during a clinic visit. Once you have the activation code, you have 60 days to go to mychart.chw.org and activate your account. If not used, the code will expire after 60 days. 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
Camp Klotty Pine – Summer 2016

Holiday Product Ordering & Delivery Schedule

With the holidays fast approaching it seems like a good time to address product delivery from BloodCenter of Wisconsin.

Please be aware of your inventories (product and supplies) at all times, and double check them on a weekly basis to assure proper inventories. You should never have less than 2 to 3 doses on hand at any time. At this time of year, place product orders when you have 4 to 5 infusions remaining at home, as delivery times may not be running as usual. If you are going on vacation, please order enough for the ENTIRE vacation, PLUS another 3 infusions.

Place your order at least 2 days prior to the desired delivery date, taking into consideration any upcoming

holiday or weekend. There is a lot of background information needed to process your order, and waiting until the last minute may delay your delivery.

Although BloodCenter of Wisconsin drivers can make next-day or same-day deliveries in emergency/life-threatening occurrences, this service should never be used as a convenience.

Keep in mind there are no deliveries on the holidays or on weekends. Additionally, CCBD is closed on the following days, and therefore there will be no staff available to take any orders:

- Monday, December 26, 2016
- Monday, January 2, 2016
